



Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)

Program Description

The Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) program is available to students who have successfully completed either the Health Occupations or Firefighter program. This year-long program consists of lectures, scenario-based discussions, simulated patients, and clinical externships on an ambulance and in the emergency room. Successful completion of this rigorous course will allow the student the challenge to take the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technician's exam, ultimately becoming a licensed EMT. Students will finish the program with credentials most employers require. Regular attendance, as well as some time outside of normal school hours, is required to meet MDCH requirements.

This course is available to **Seniors** who are able to show proof of up-to-date immunizations, willing to receive industry required immunizations, are able to pass a drug test, and meet criteria for ONE of the following:

- Successful completion of Health Occupations and recommendation from instructor.
- Active participation in a Junior Firefighter or Explorer program on Emergency Services as evidenced by group leader recommendation.
- Successful completion of a high school Anatomy and Physiology course and a strong interest in health care, medicine, or emergency service career areas plus recommendation from teachers or counselors.
